

WEINGUT ROBERT WEIL

Founded in 1875, Weingut Robert Weil is considered to be one of the Rheingau's younger wine estates. It is located in the heart of Kiedrich, a village first documented in the year 950. Kiedrich Turmberg and Kiedrich Gräfenberg, the estate's top vineyards, are among the finest sites in the Rheingau.

The estate cultivates 70 hectares (173 acres) of vineyards, of which 98 percent are planted with Riesling. Today, Wilhelm Weil, the great-grandson of the estate's founder, carries on the uncompromising, quality-oriented vineyard and cellar practices that have been the hallmark of the winery for four generations.

2010 WEINGUT ROBERT WEIL ESTATE RIESLING DRY



Made with the same exacting standards and meticulous attention to detail as the great single-vineyard wines, the estate wines from Robert Weil are the starting point for the vinous journey into the best of the Rheingau. The fruit for these wines comes from vineyard parcels that are adjacent to the top sites: Kiedrich Wasseros and Sandgrub. The deep and medium-deep soils of the vineyards consist of stony, fragmented phyllite mixed with loess and loam. The character of this Riesling, like all Robert Weil Rieslings, is defined largely by these mineral-rich soils.

2010 TASTING NOTES

The 2010 growing season in the Rheingau got off to a late start after a long, snowy winter. Cool summer temperatures and a wet September caused worries that the grapes might not ripen fully. But beautiful, sunny weather in October brought full ripeness, long hang time and extraordinary concentration to the wines.

The 2010 Estate Riesling Dry has an intense stony lemon aroma, with a firm, dense texture, well-balanced dryness and a fine fruit finish.
